Partnership Spotlight: Fulda University of Applied Sciences

In 2011, SUNY Cortland and Fulda University of Applied Science, in Germany, entered into a cultural and academic exchange partnership that has flourished ever since. SUNY Cortland Philosophy Professor Mecke Nagel, a native of Fulda, has been instrumental in forging the connections between the two institutions, first through Fulda's Department of Social and Cultural Studies, and then expanding in 2017 to include the Departments of Social Work and Business. Discussions on adding the Department of Nursing and Health Sciences are currently underway as an avenue for exchange of students interested in the health fields.



Since the program's inception, 37 Fulda exchange students have come to Cortland and 38 SUNY students have <u>studied at Fulda</u>, and currently, three Fulda students are taking online classes through Cortland. Faculty and staff mobility has been equally active through teaching exchange and visits by several Fulda and Cortland faculty and administrators, including Drs. Mecke Nagel, Gigi Peterson, German Zarate, Ute Ritz-Deutch, Scott Moranda, Seth Asumah, President Bitterbaum, Hugh Anderson, and Mary Schlarb.

This spring, the vibrant Fulda-Cortland partnership has taken on an exciting new dimension, when Fulda selected SUNY Cortland with five other universities to collaborate on projects funded by a substantial grant from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). In addition to supporting further student and faculty exchange, proposed activities include joint participation in the SUNY Model European Union, coordinated by Dr. Alex Balas, and collaborative online international learning (COIL) courses.


Fulbright Scholar Program

Fall 2021 Student Visa Processing

MARCH 18, 2021

Letter to Secretary of Homeland Security and Secretary of State; The American Council on Education (ACE) joined 40 other organizations in a letter to Secretaries Mayorkas (Department of Homeland Security) and Blinken (Department of State) urging the agencies to take steps to prepare for the Fall 2021 semester, including:

- Timely and efficient processing of visa applications.
- Waiving the in-person interview requirement for students, or allow for online interviews
- Issuing ICE policy guidance for the coming Fall, and allow students to enter the U.S. for study
- Extending the exemption for students to allow travel from all the COVID travel restricted countries, not just from the European Schengen area, the U.K., and Ireland.
