The elected officers of the faculty shall be the chair of the Senate who is also the presiding officer of the faculty, the vice chair who is also the chair-designate, the secretary, the treasurer, and the past presiding chair.</p>	<p>There is no formal process in place for the immediate past chair to offer help and advice on items that may cross over from one year to the next. Informally, the past presiding chair is already providing this kind of assistance, but without any kind of guidelines. This will allow there to be a formal position for the past chair and legitimate the presence of the past presiding chair on the steering committee.</p> <p>These positions exist in other SUNY comprehensive colleges (e.g. Geneseo, Brockport, and Oneonta), so there is precedent in place at other similar colleges.</p>

The committee thinks it is important to have the past presiding chair at the steering committee to ensure continuity of efforts, but the past presiding chair should only attend senate meetings at the request of the current chair.</p>
